What is Hazard Mitigation?



"Any sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards."



Examples:

- Limiting development in high-risk areas
- Retrofitting structures to protect them from floods, high winds, etc.
- Minor drainage flood control projects in areas of localized flooding
- Fire safety education

Benefits of Hazard Mitigation


- Makes community eligible to apply for MEMA/FEMA grant opportunities for hazard mitigation projects
- Manages Risk
- Having a plan provides an approach for using limited resources more effectively




Components of a Hazard Mitigation Plan

- How effective are current mitigation capabilities?
- What new strategies could be implemented?

Hazard Identification and Risk Analysis			
Type of Hazard	Location of Occurrence	Impacts	Probability of Future Events
Flooding (100-yr)	Medium	Critical	Moderate
Flooding (localized)	Small	Limited	High
Dam Failure	Medium	Catastrophic	Very Low
Drought	Large	Minor	Low
Extreme Temperatures	Large	Limited - Critical	High
Wildfire / Brushfire	Small	Limited	Low - Moderate
Hurricane/ Tropical Storm	Large	Limited	Low
Severe Winter Storm / Nor'easter	Large	Critical	High
Severe Thunderstorm / Wind / Tornado	Small - Medium	Limited	Severe thunderstorms: High Winds: High Tornadoes: Very Low
Earthquake	Large	Limited	Very Low
Hazardous Materials	Small-Medium	Limited	Low

Existing Mitigation Capabilities

- Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan
- Effective Building and Zoning Codes in Place
 - Including resource protection overlay zones
- Dedicated Staff and Volunteers
- Shelter Supplies and Emergency Generators in Place
