Course Name: Local Mitigation Planning Workshop (G-318)

Course Purpose: This in-person, 2-day workshop covers the fundamentals of the hazard mitigation planning

requirements for communities to develop new or updated Local Hazard Mitigation Plans that address community priorities and needs and meet requirements established in 44 CFR 201. This workshop describes the planning process, the requirements for stakeholder involvement, assessing risks and developing effective hazard mitigation strategies. Finally, the basic elements of the plan review, approval, and update cycle are discussed, including tips for implementing and maintaining an approved plan, tracking performance, keeping stakeholders involved, integrating and incorporating into other local planning processes, and preventing

plans from lapsing or expiring.

Target Audience: Local and tribal government officials, land use planners, emergency managers, floodplain

managers, and others who are involved in the development or update of a local, tribal, or special districts Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan. People generally involved in mitigation

planning also may find this training beneficial.
