

AGAWAM

Agawam was the first colonial settlement in the Pioneer Valley region in 1635. The Connecticut River forms the Town's eastern border and is the basis for Agawam's name, a Native American word meaning "crooked river." Over time the town developed a rich agricultural industry which, while still evident, has largely declined in favor of residential, commercial and industrial growth. Since 1990, the town's population has increased by almost 5 percent to 28,626 in 2014.

Agawam benefits from its location near the regional highway system and nearby airport, providing a link to many of the area's opportunities. Today, Agawam is a residential community for residents who commute to both Springfield and neighboring Connecticut, and is also home to a thriving commercial and industrial center. State Route 57, the Town's primary highway, provides direct access to the Agawam Regional Industrial Park.

Agawam prides itself on a small town atmosphere where many people participate in civic activities, school affairs, and sports events. Recent home construction has coincided with the town's effort to protect its historic open spaces and rural character. Agawam may be most widely known as the home of Six Flags New England, the largest amusement park in New England. Six Flags attracts visitors from throughout the Northeast. The park's carousel is a landmark located on the National Register of Historic Places.
