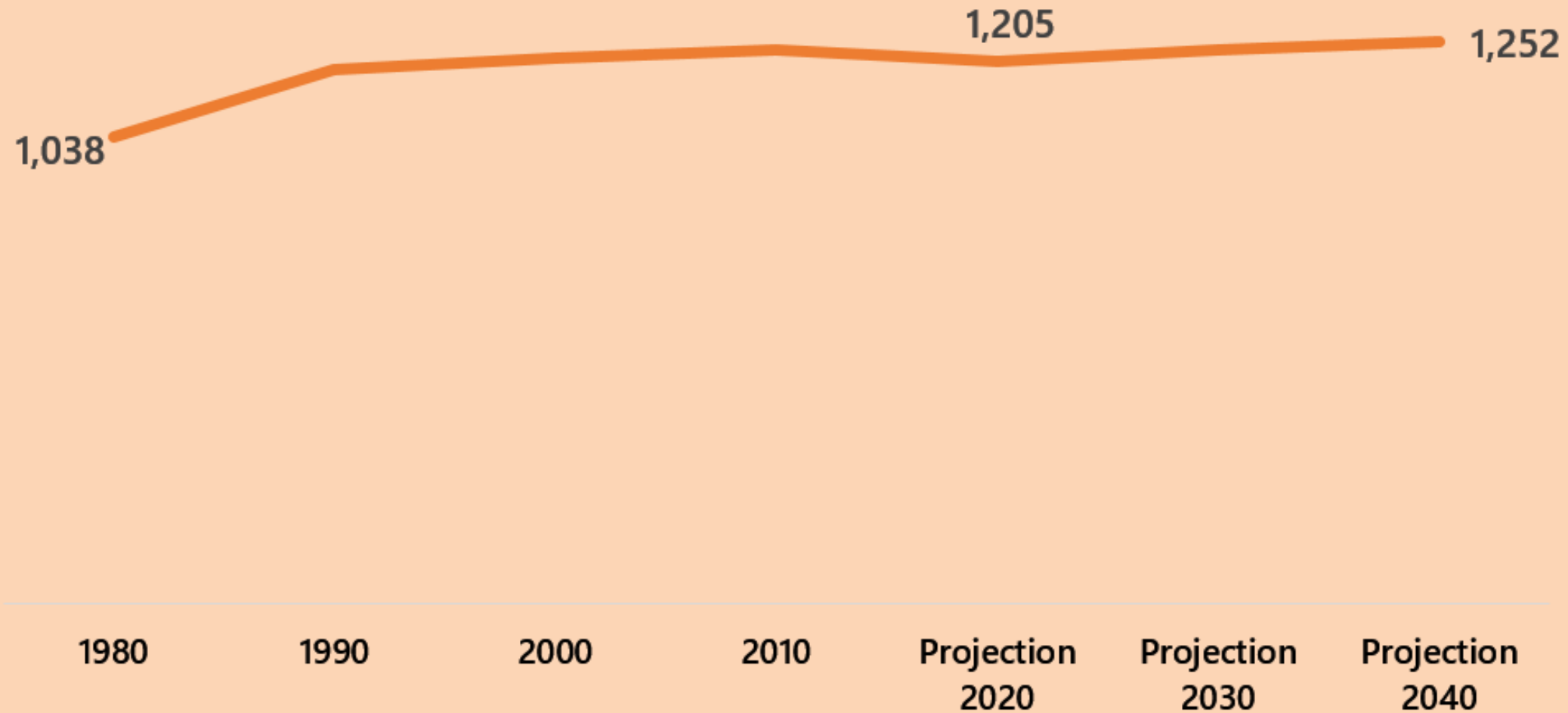


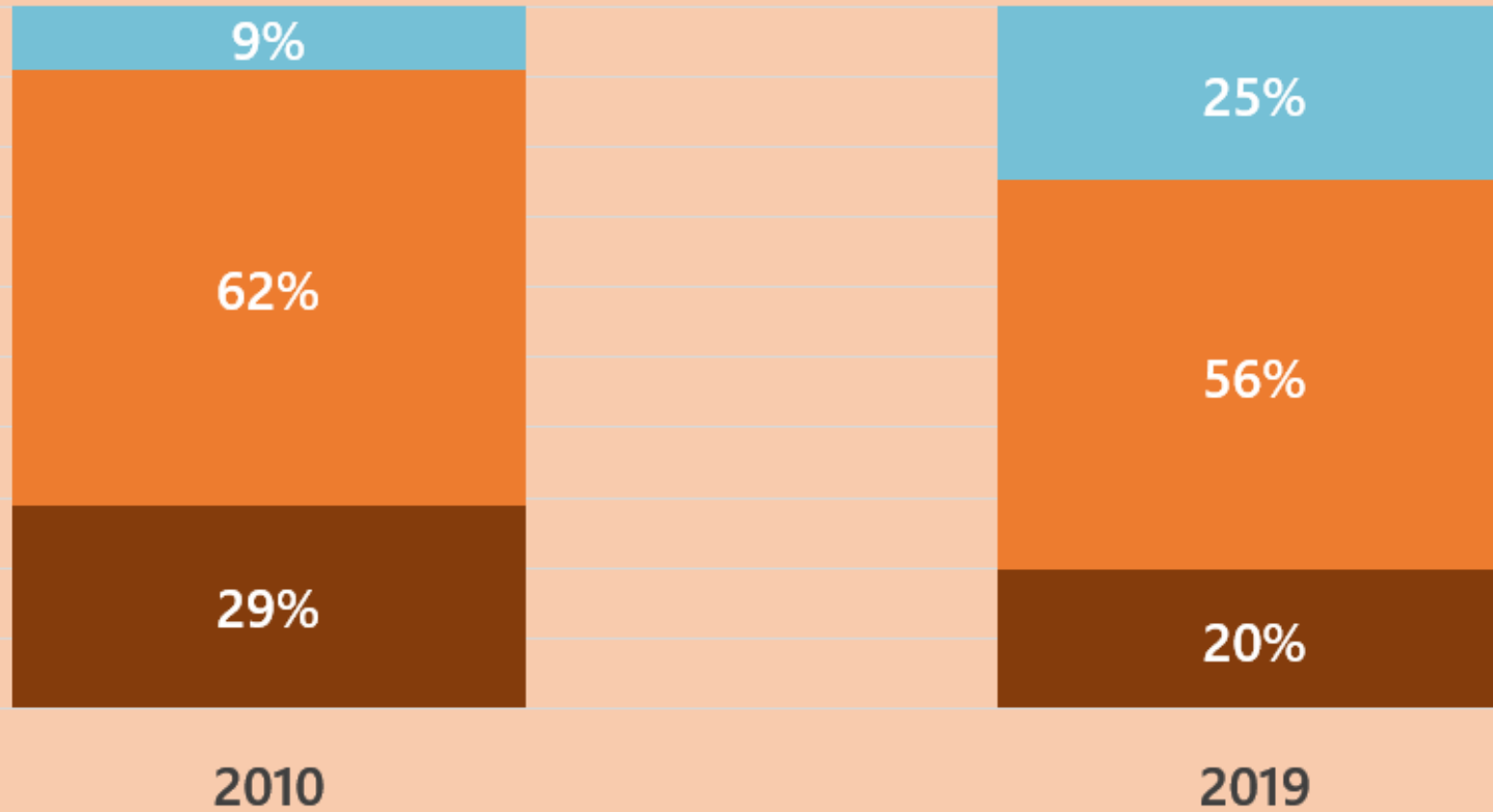
Blandford's population has been essentially stagnant in recent decades, and is projected to grow only very modestly over next 20 years

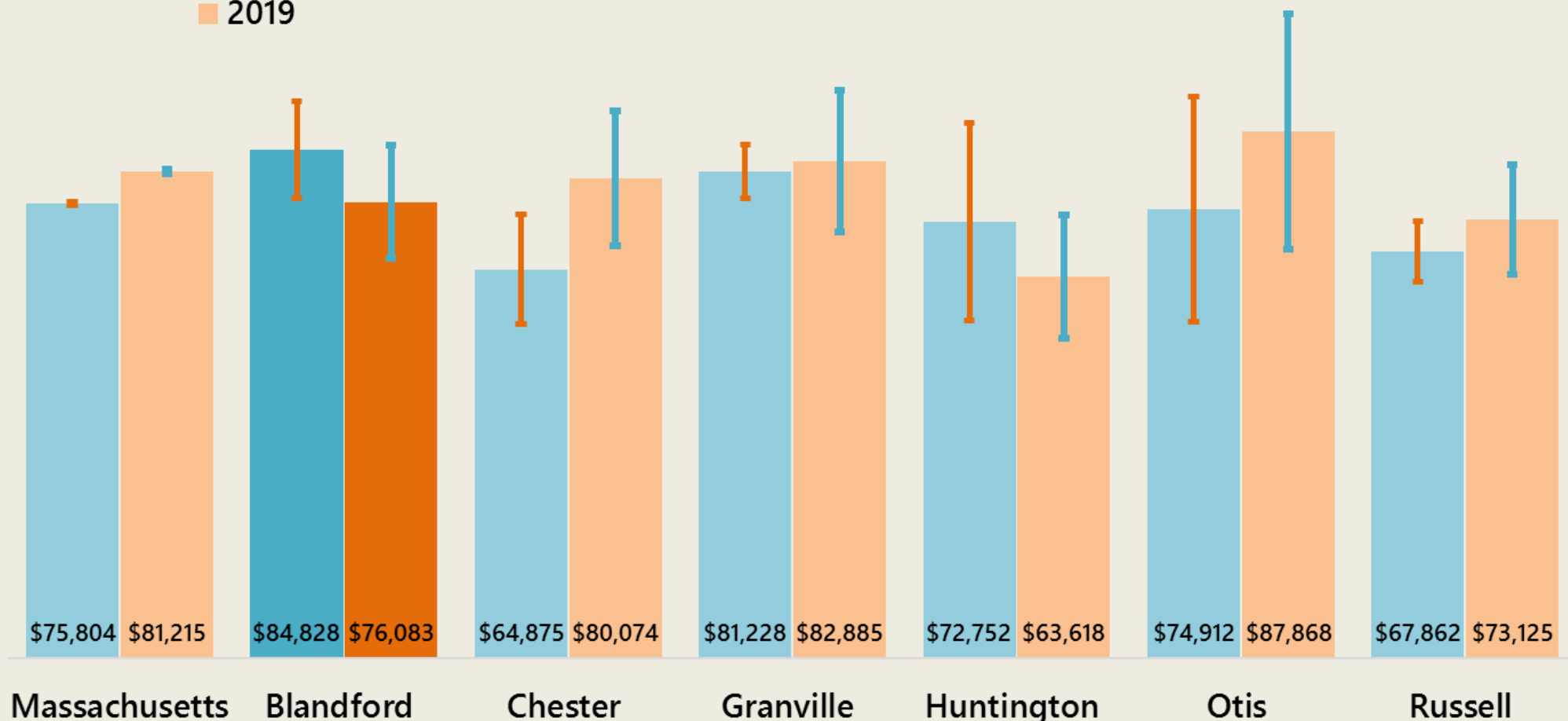
**Blandford's Senior Population has grown considerably

- Children and Young Adults (Under age 25)

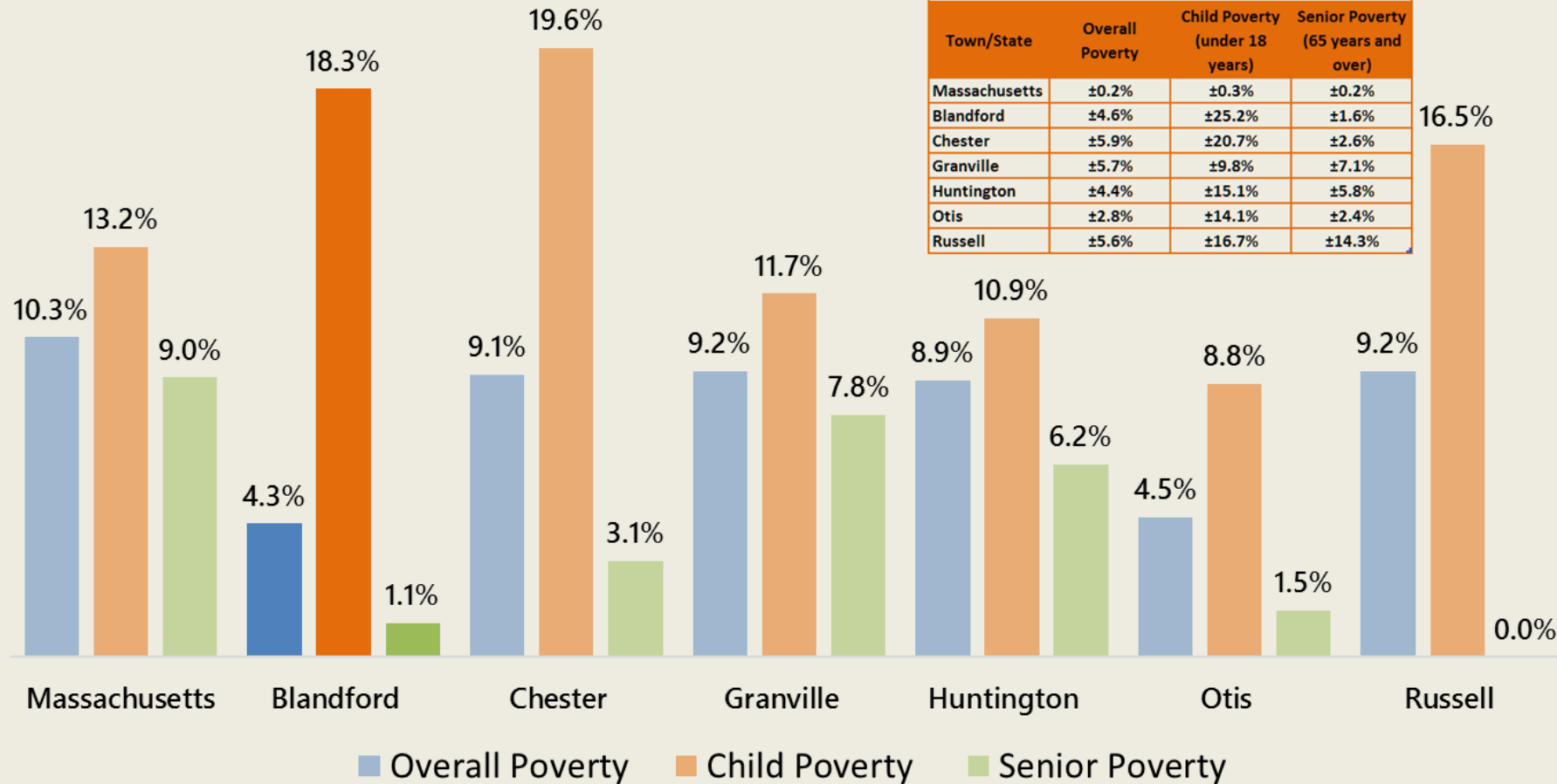
Blandford's median household income appears to have declined between 2010 and 2019, but remains similar to the statewide medium income and broadly comparable to Blandford's neighboring communities

Blandford's overall poverty rate is estimated to be 4.3%, its child poverty rate 18.3%, and its senior poverty rate 1.1%: because of the small sample size, range of potential values much wider

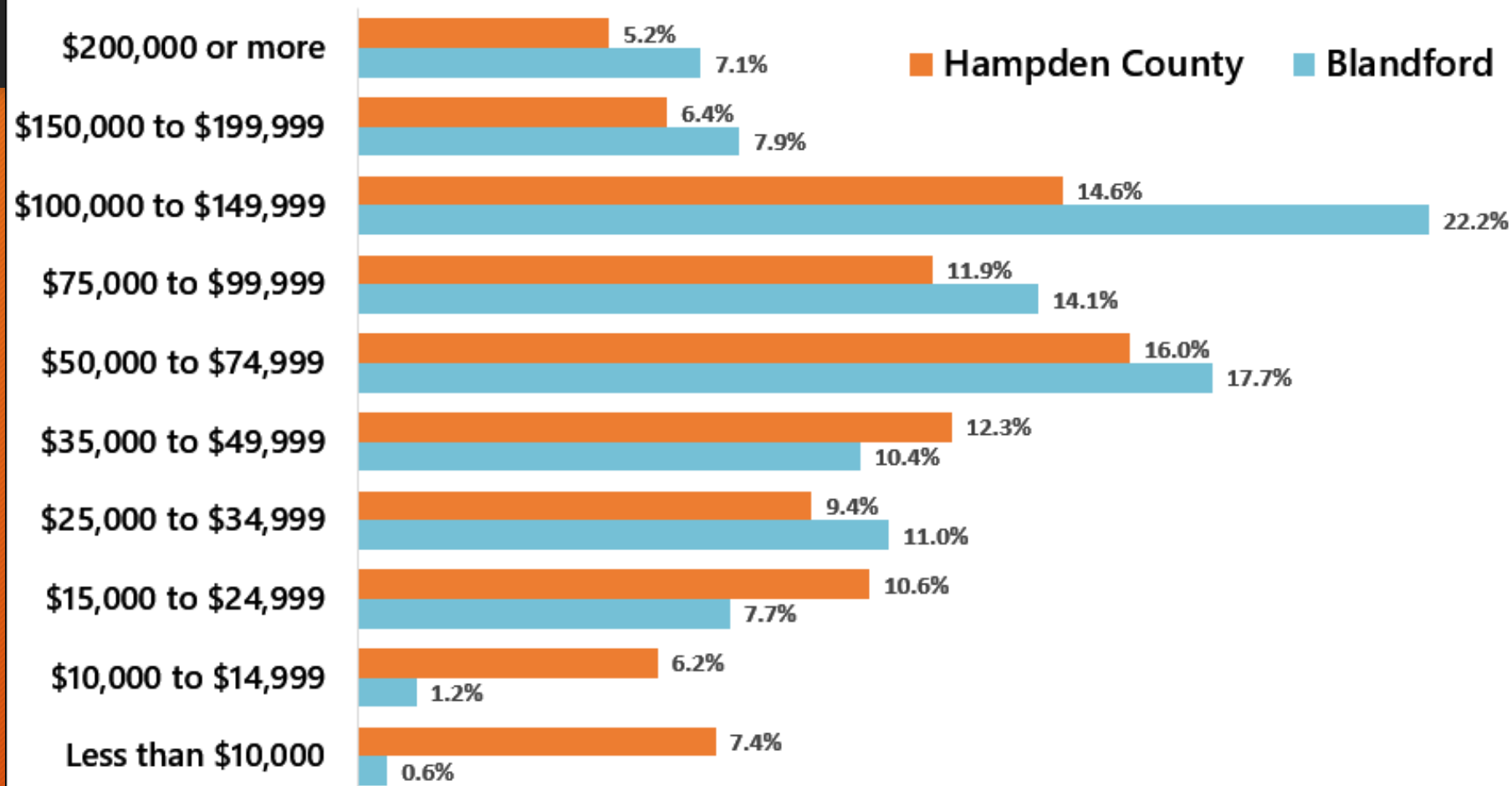

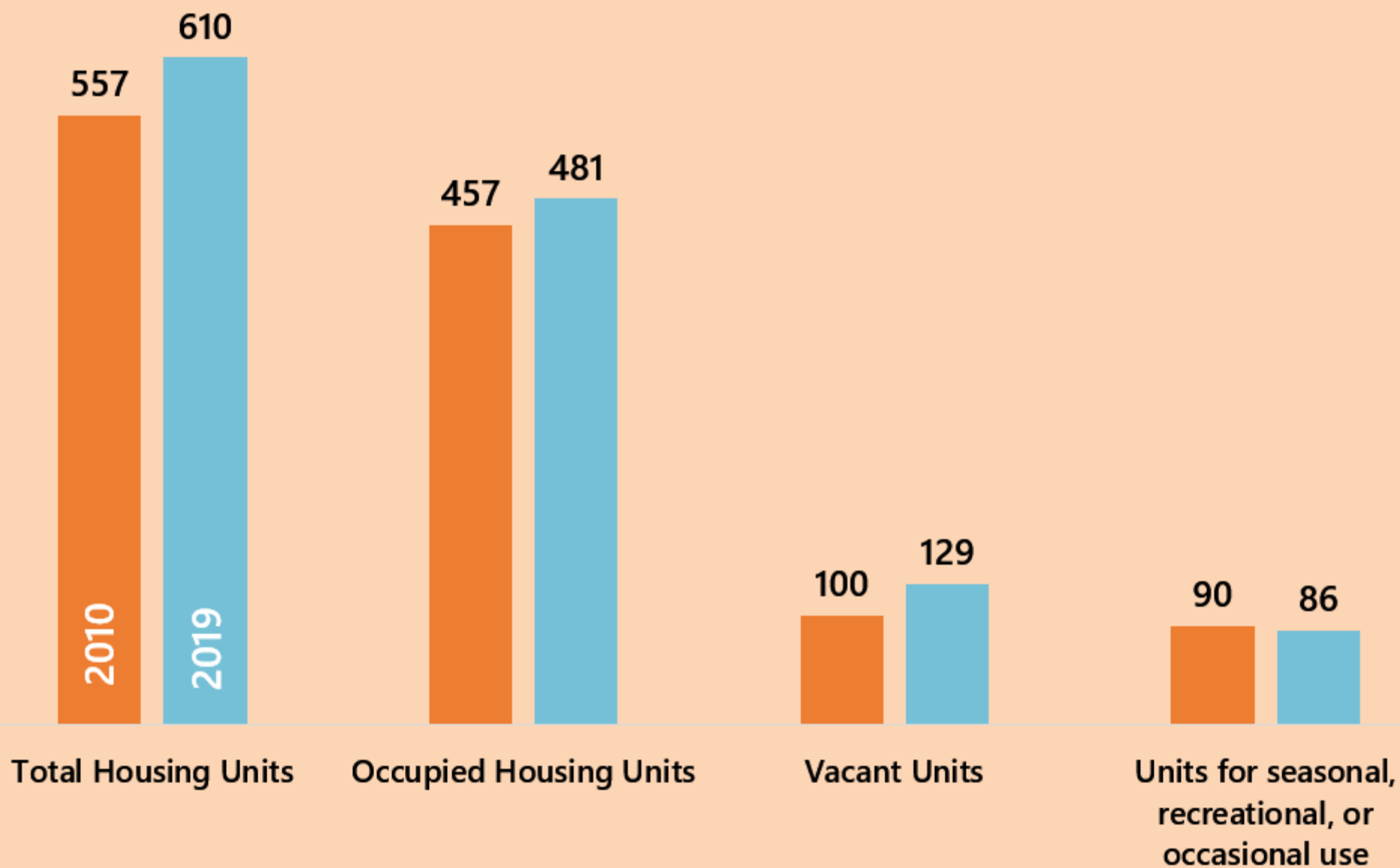

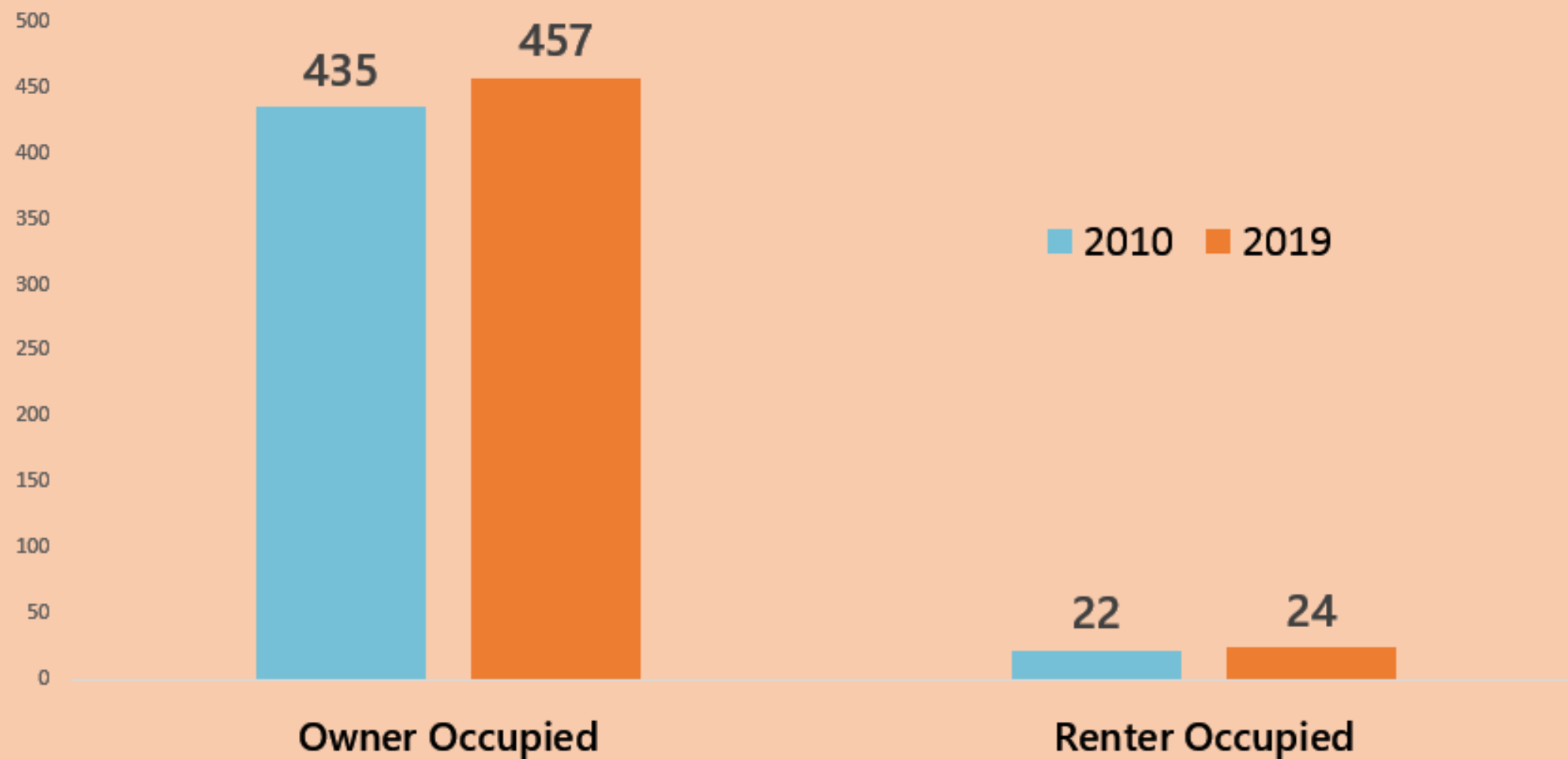


Share of Households at Each Income Level

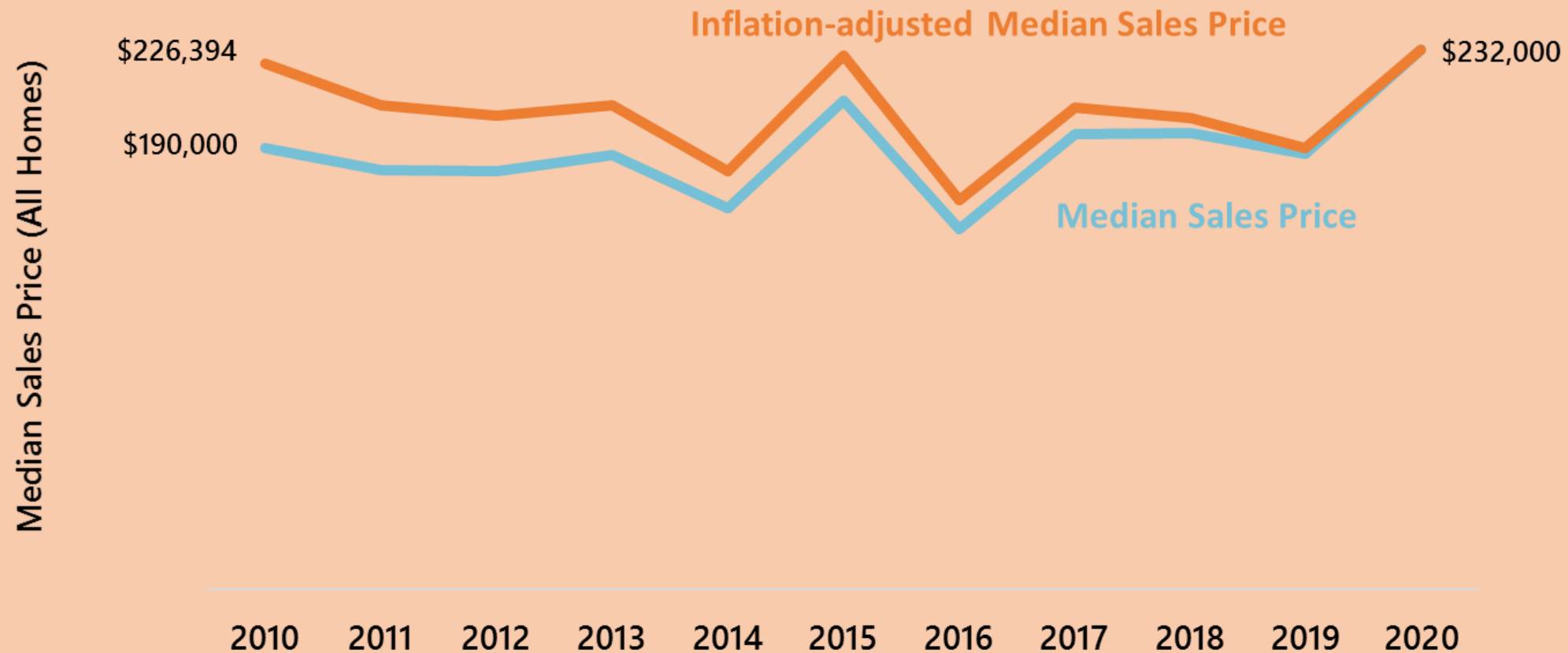
Blandford adds housing units and maintains similar patterns of occupancy between 2010 and 2019



Blandford's housing stock continues to consist predominantly of owner-occupied homes



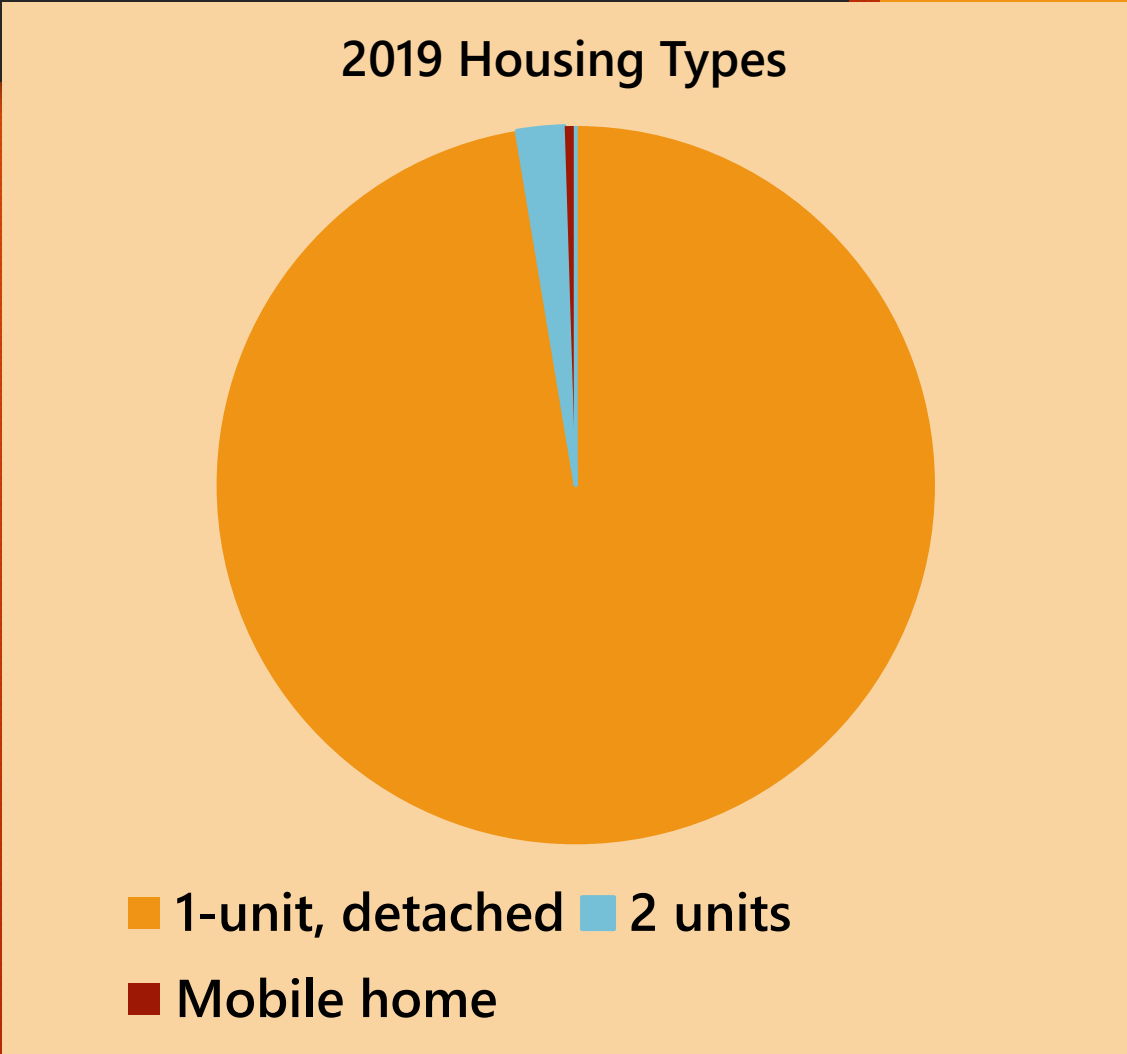
The small number of annual home sales in Blandford can result in substantial fluctuations from one year to the next; 24% increase in median single family home sales price in 2020 compared with 2019



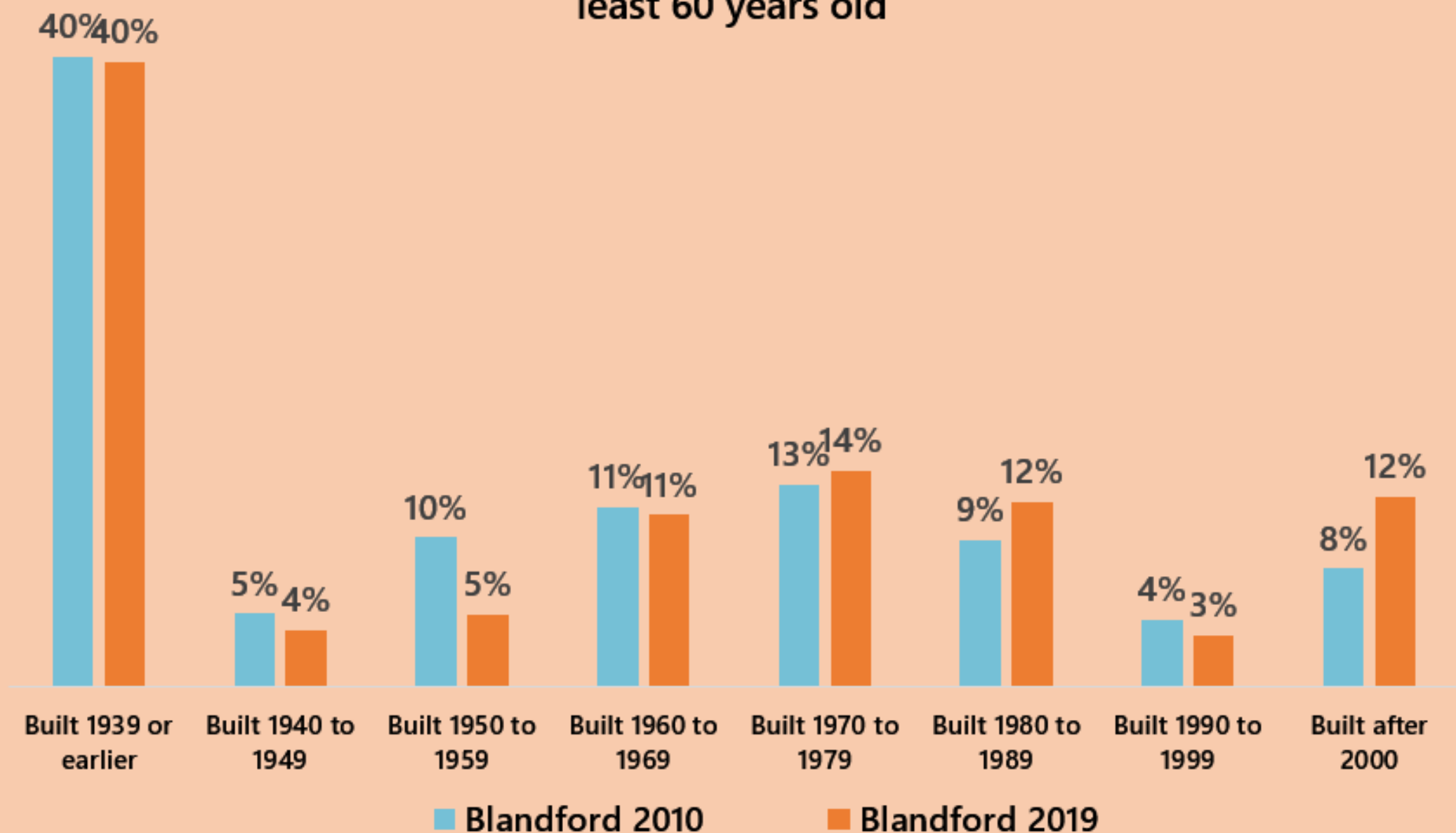

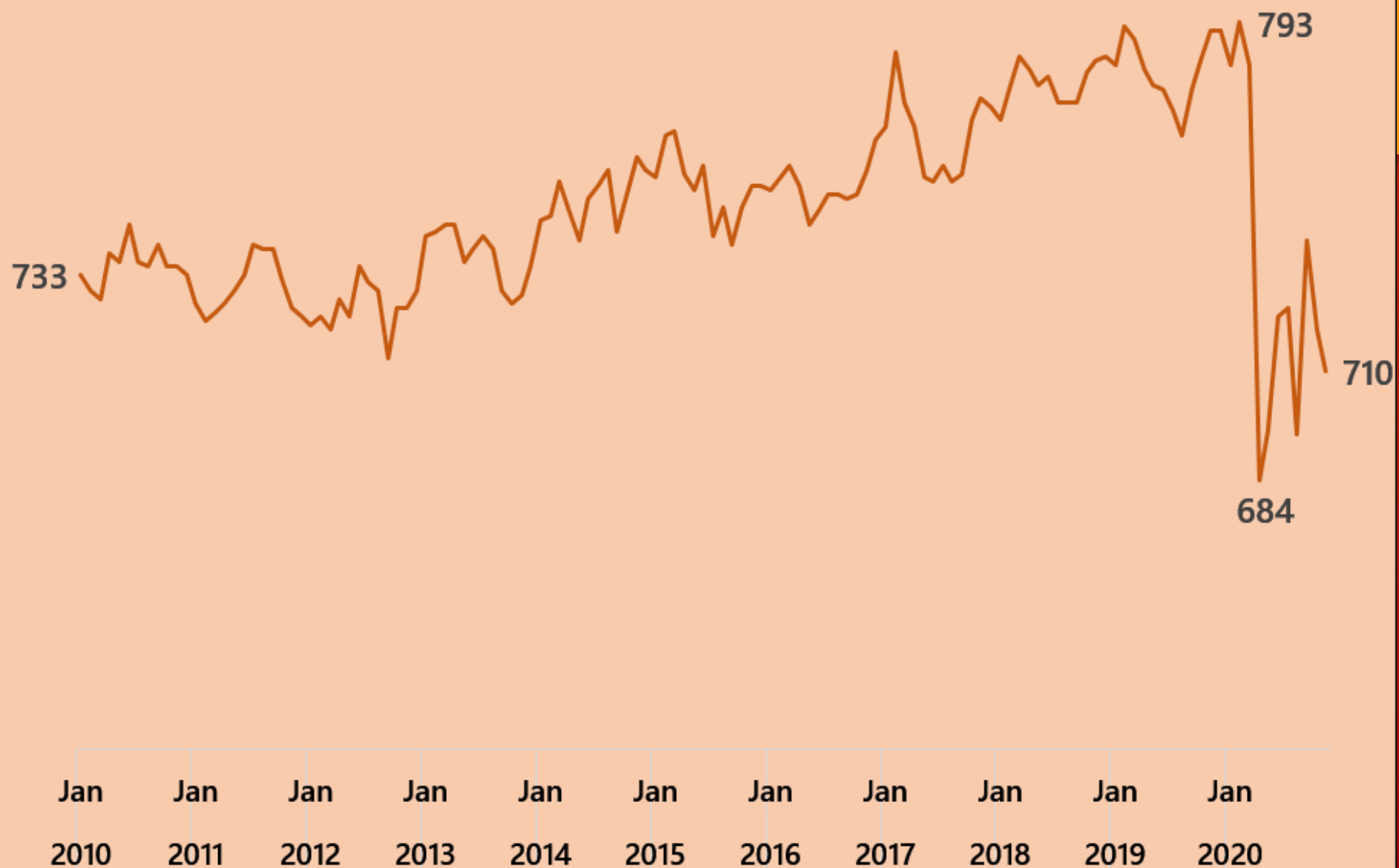

Blandford's housing stock continues to age: nearly half (48%) is at least 60 years old

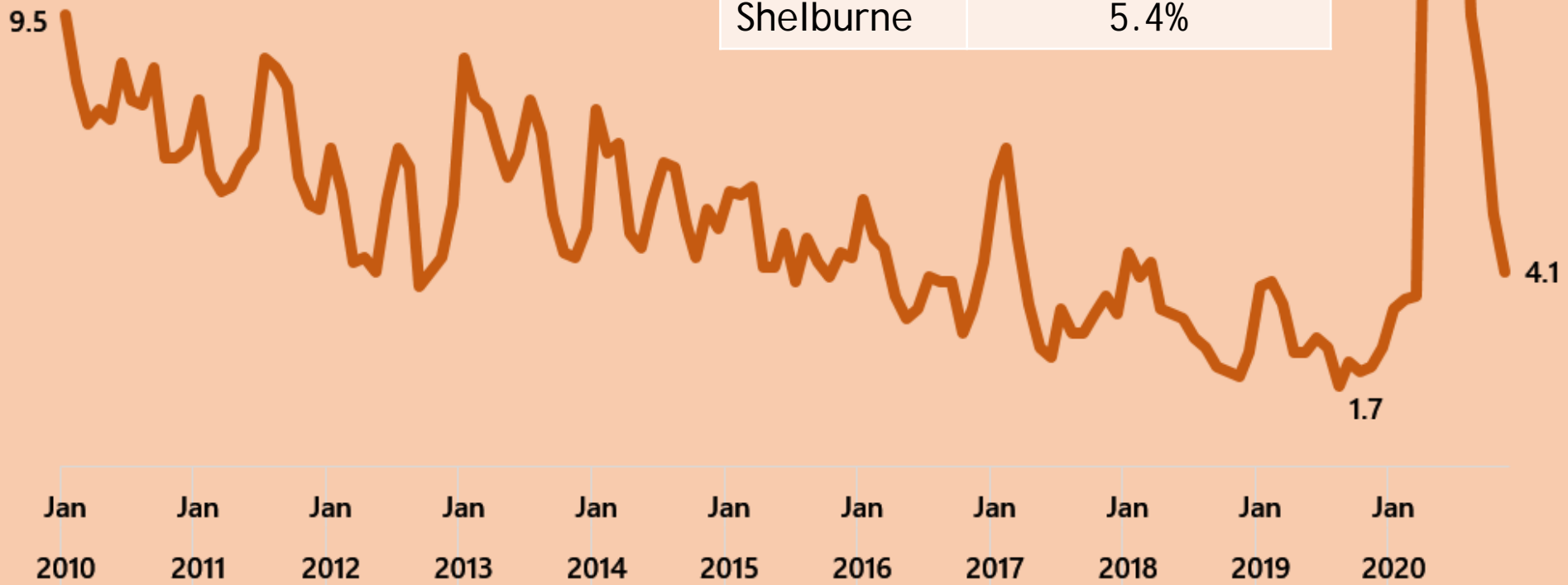


Blandford's Labor Force had been growing slowly until COVID19 hit hard in April 2020

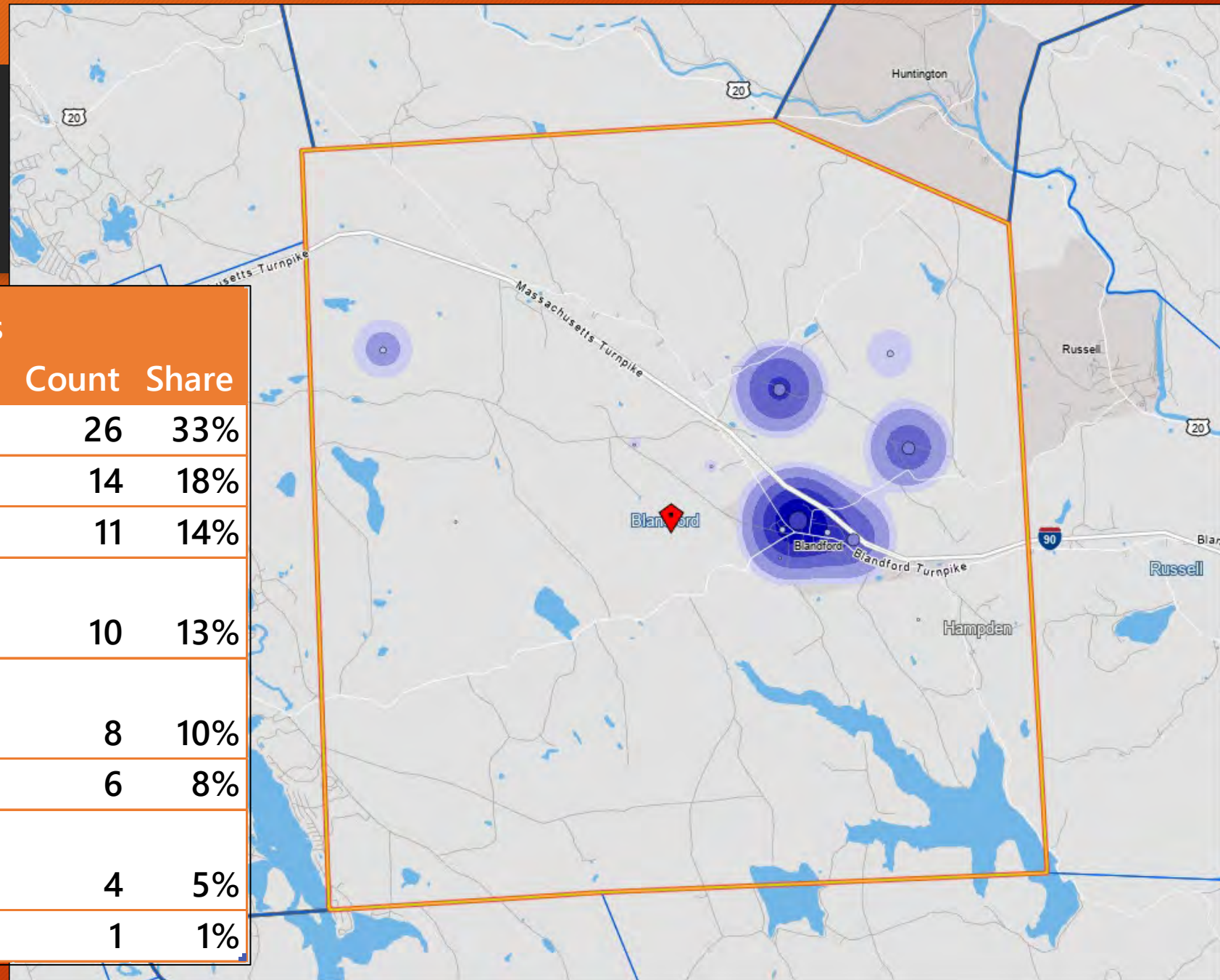

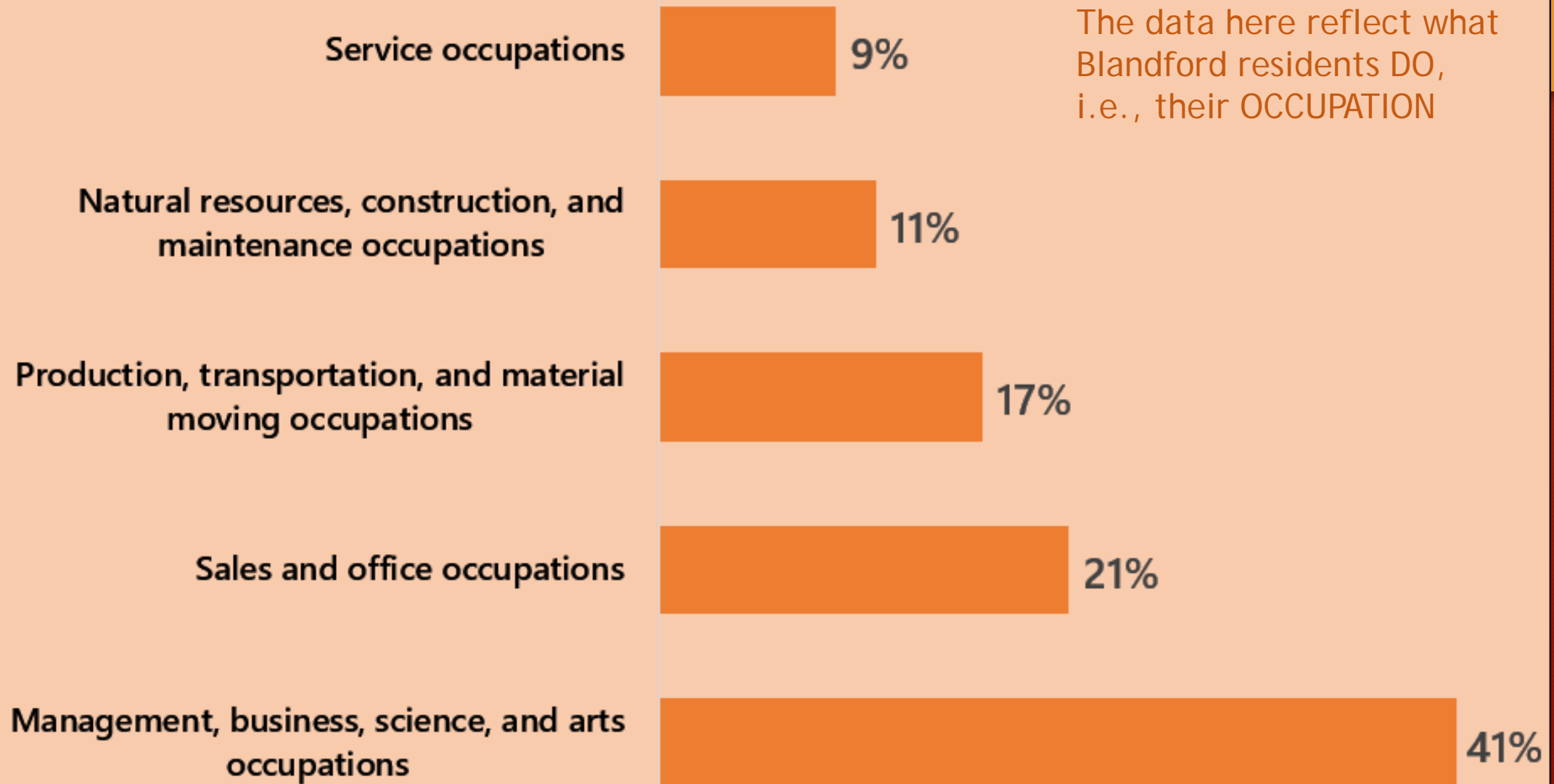

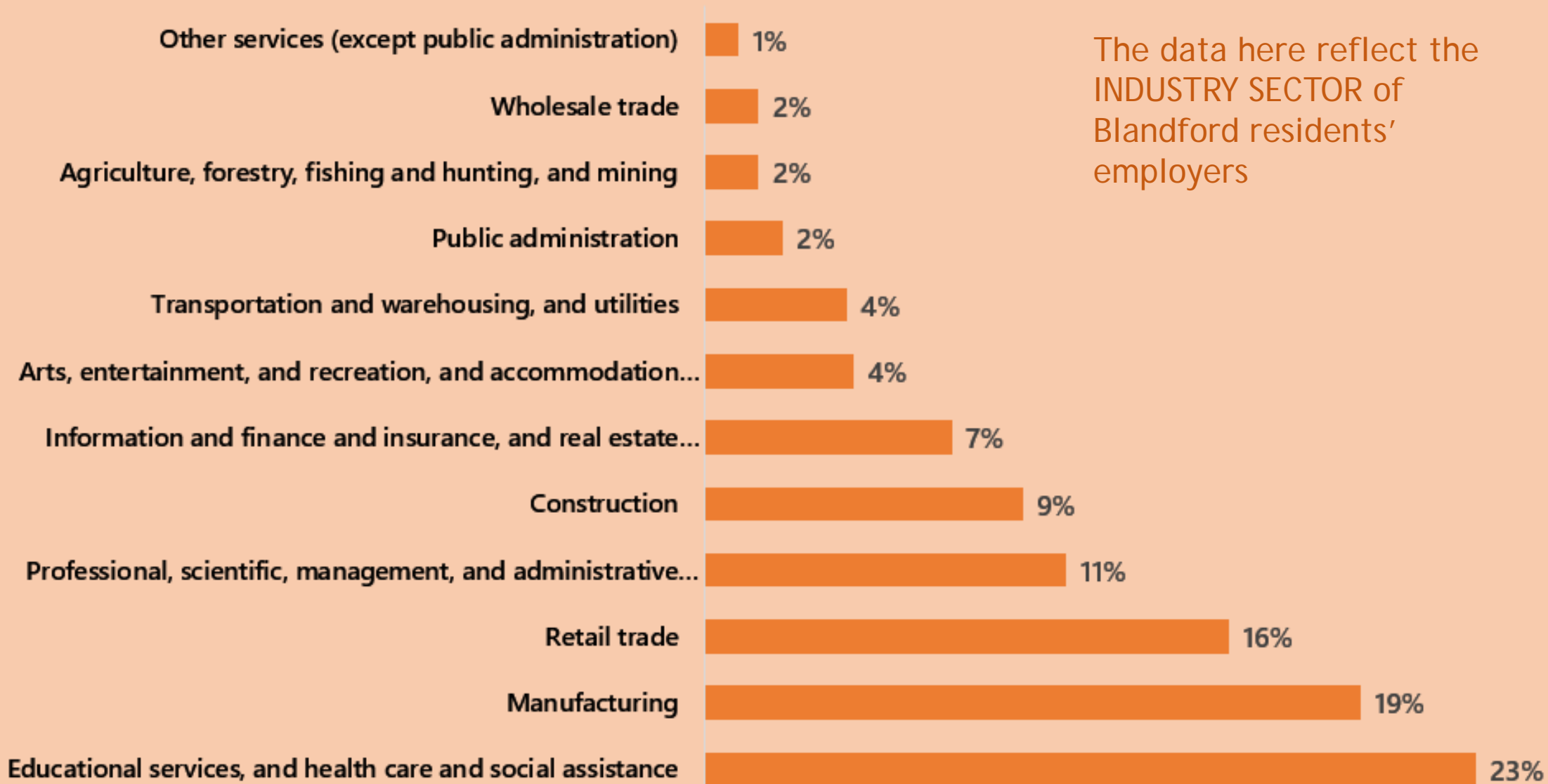

Where do Blandford workers live?

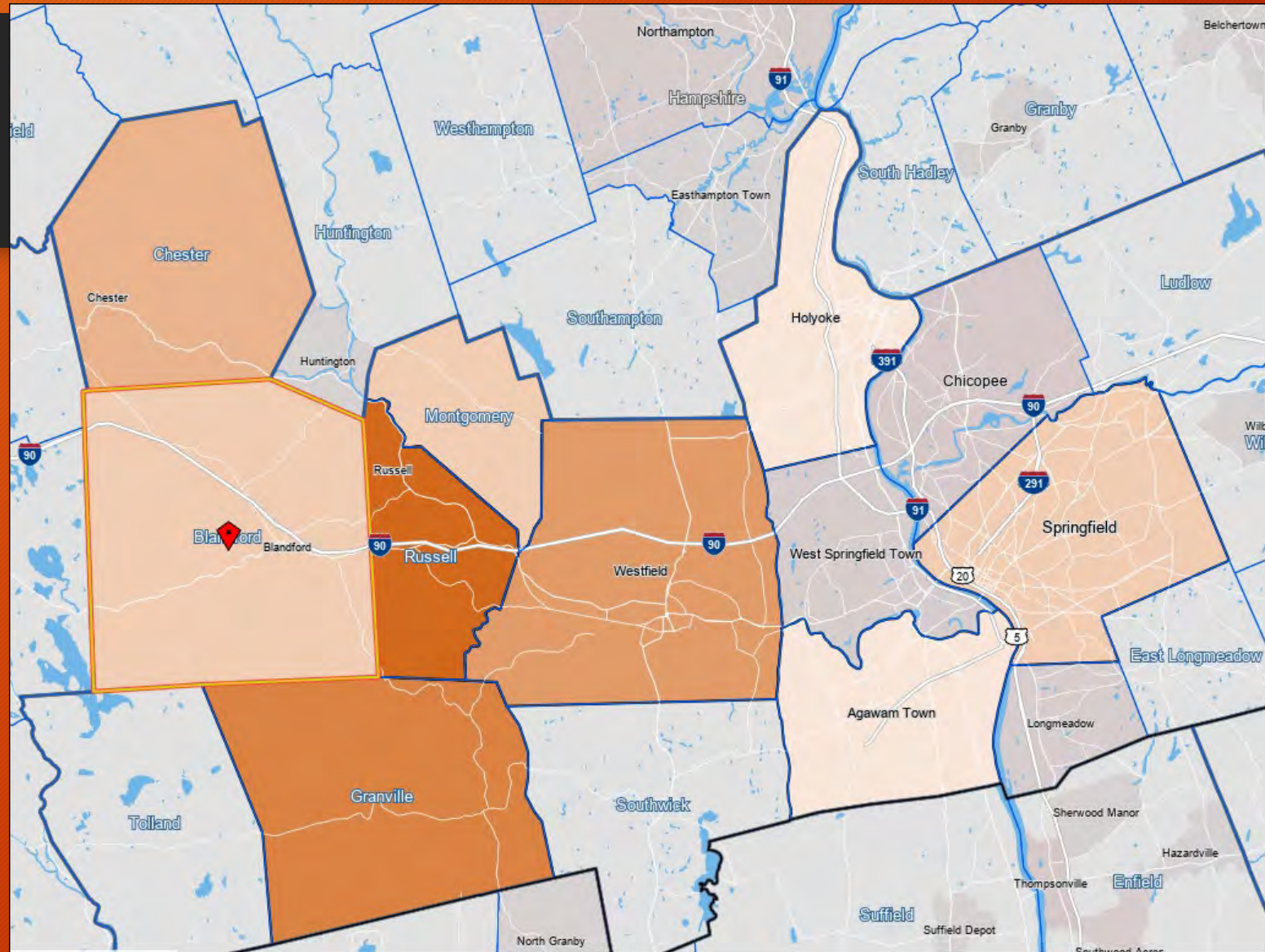

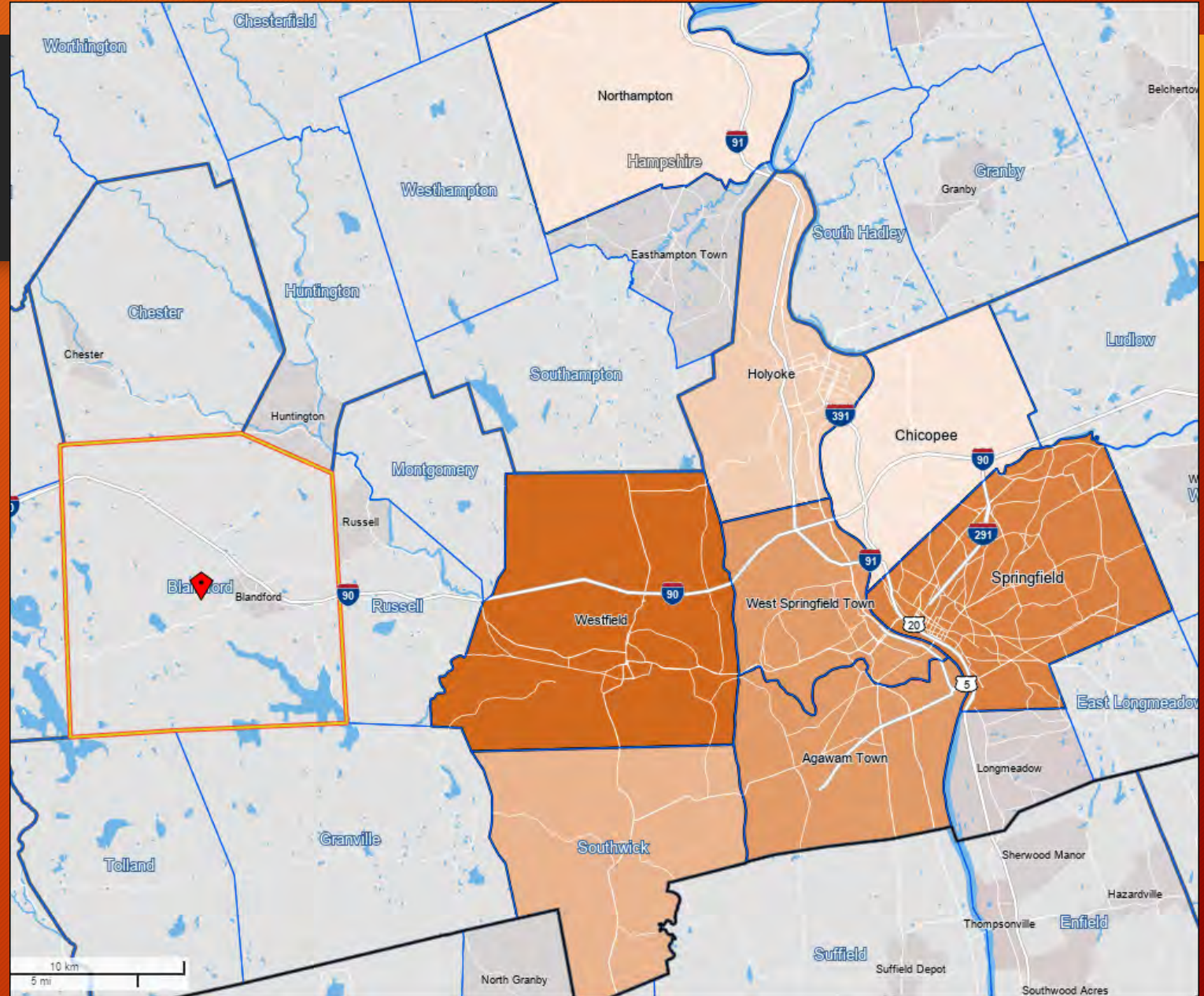

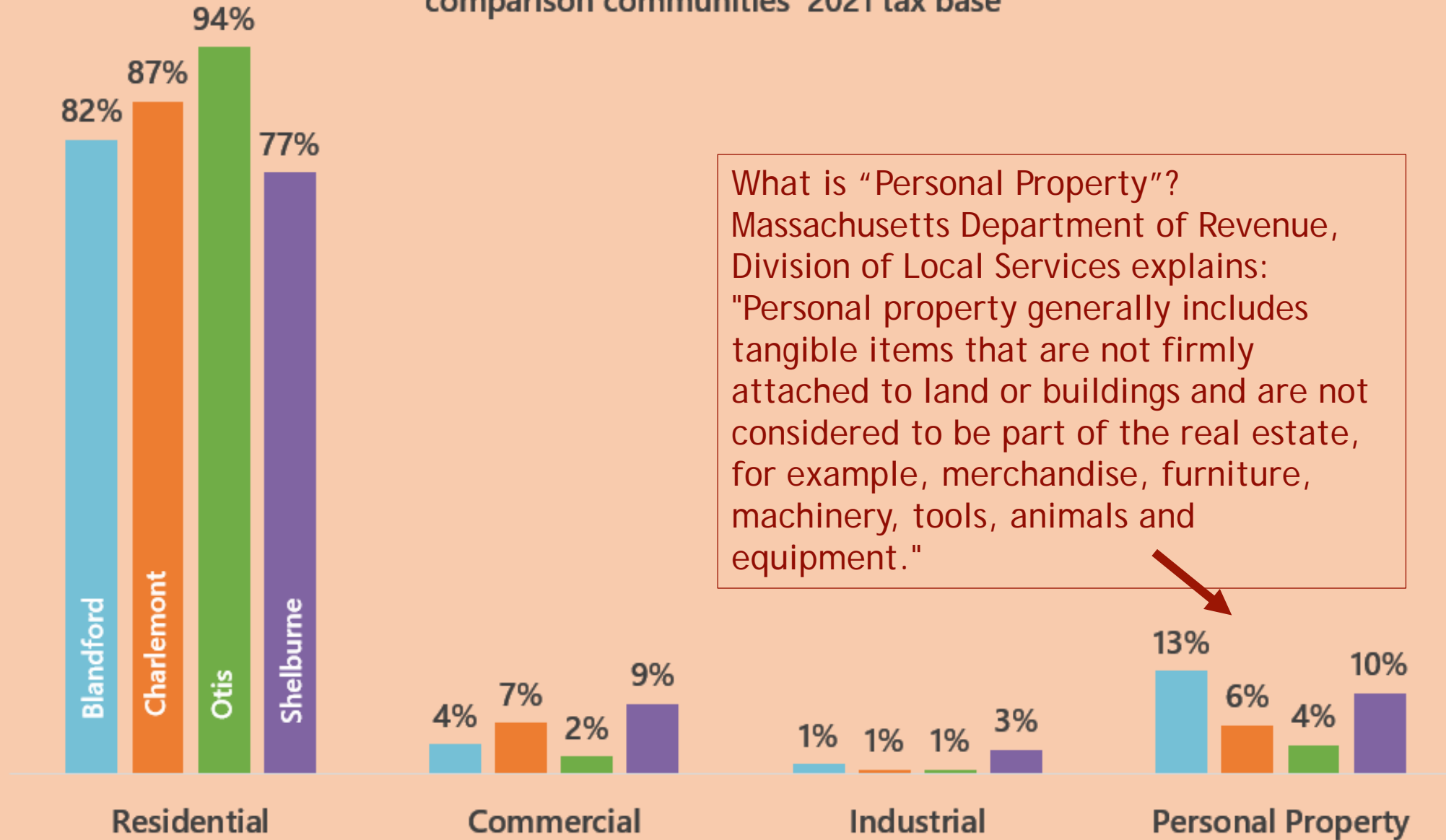

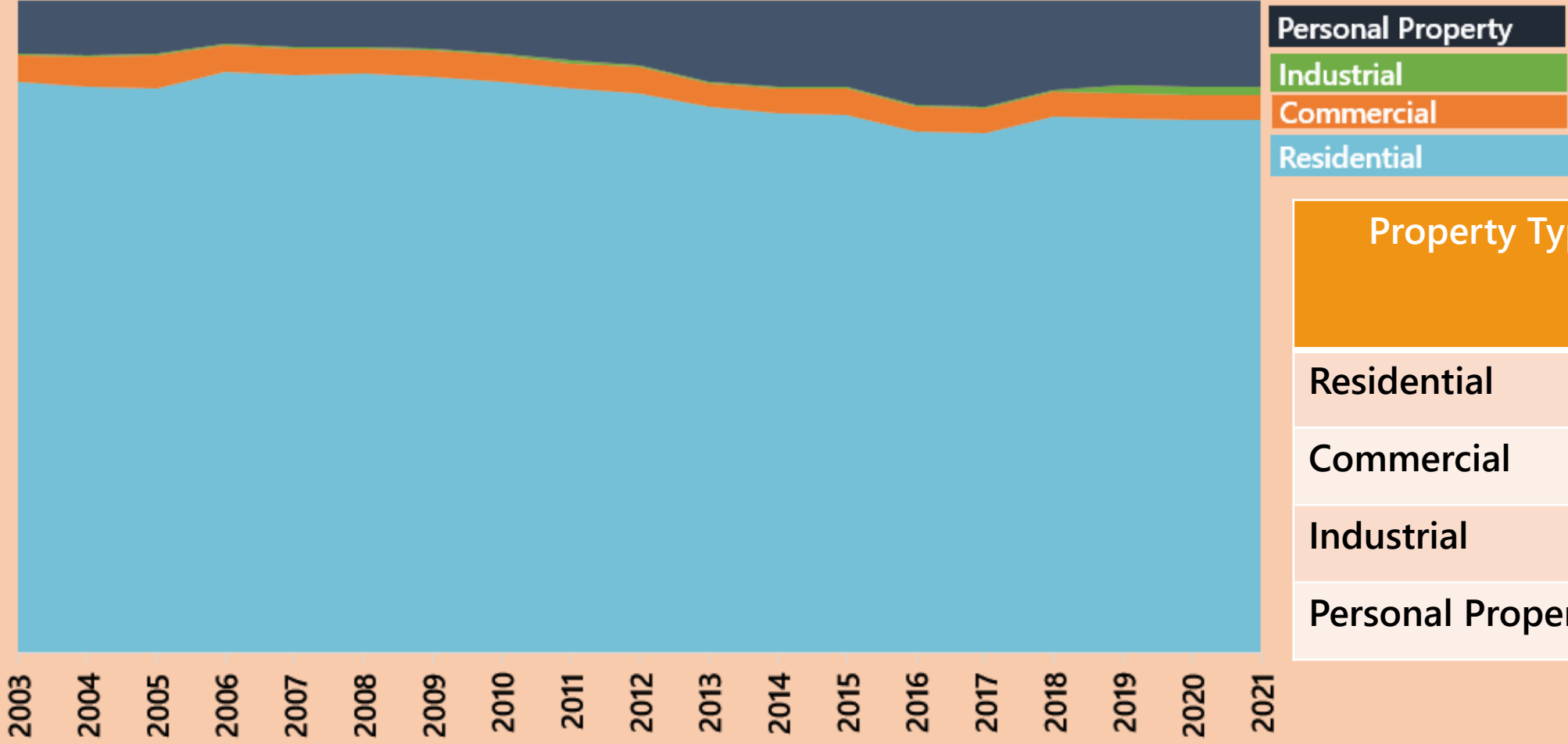


Assessed value of residential property comprises majority of Blandford's and its comparison communities' 2021 tax base



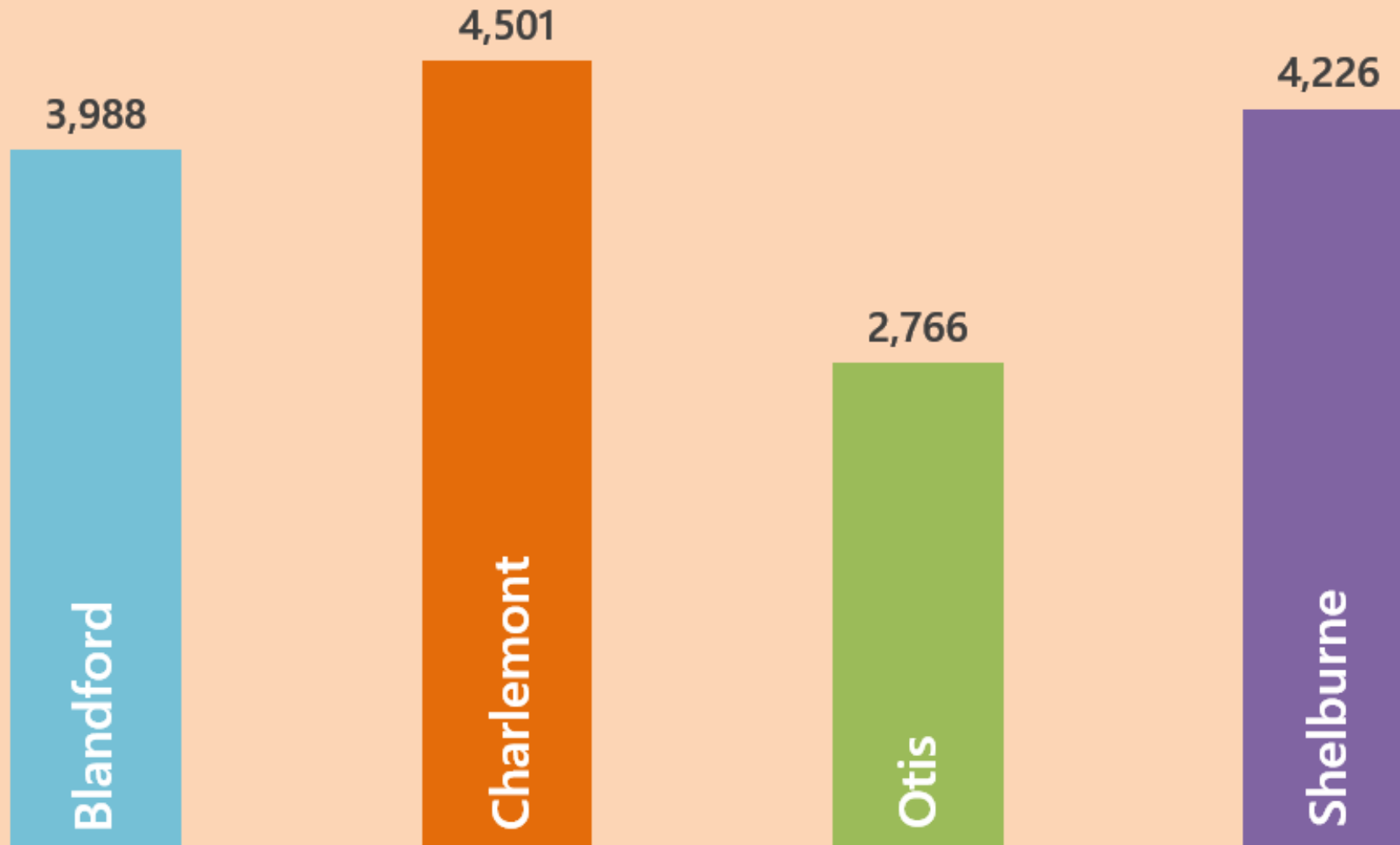

Since 2003, Personal Property's Share of Assessed Land in Blandford has increased



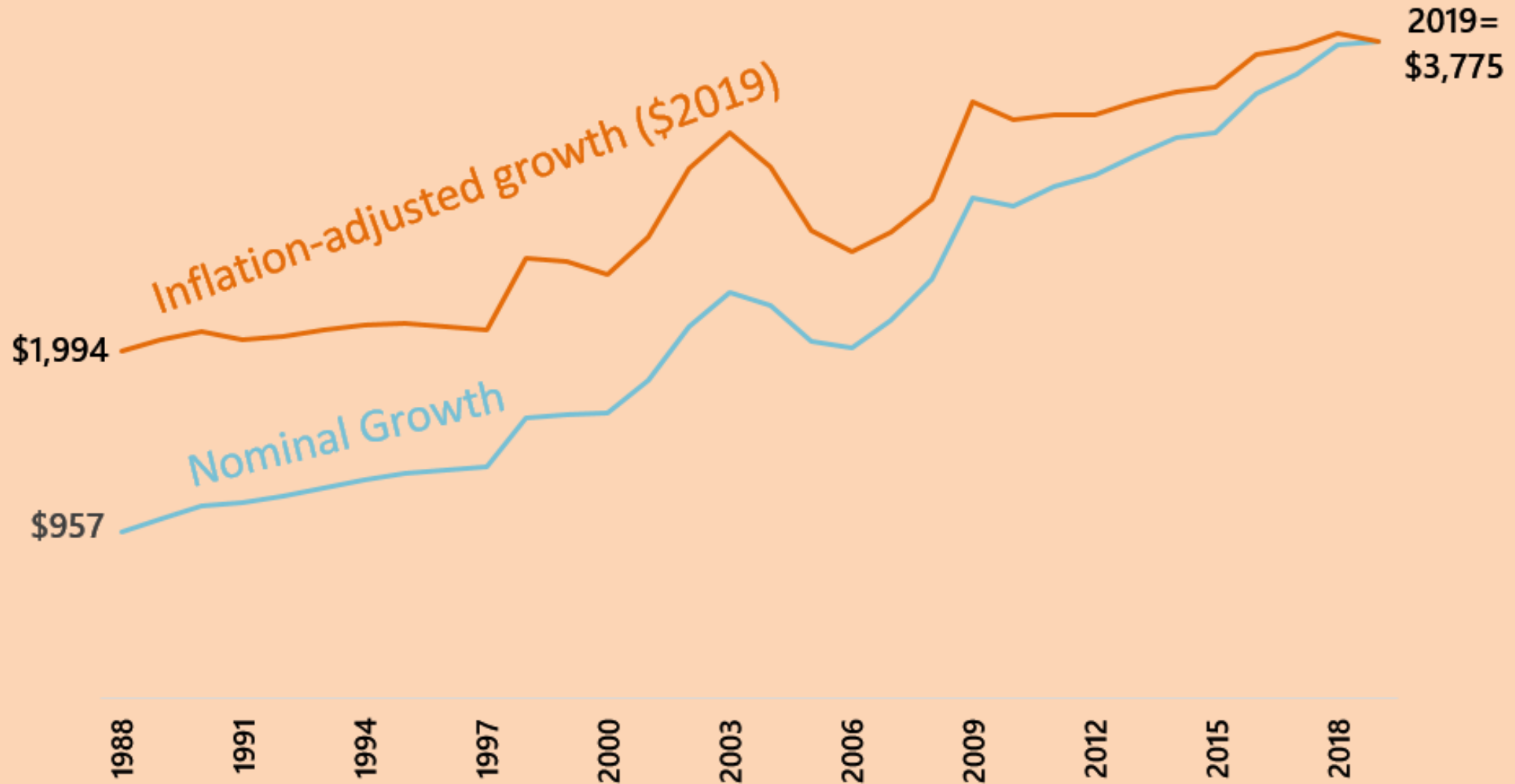

Blandford's 2021 average single family tax bill compares favorably with most of its comparison communities

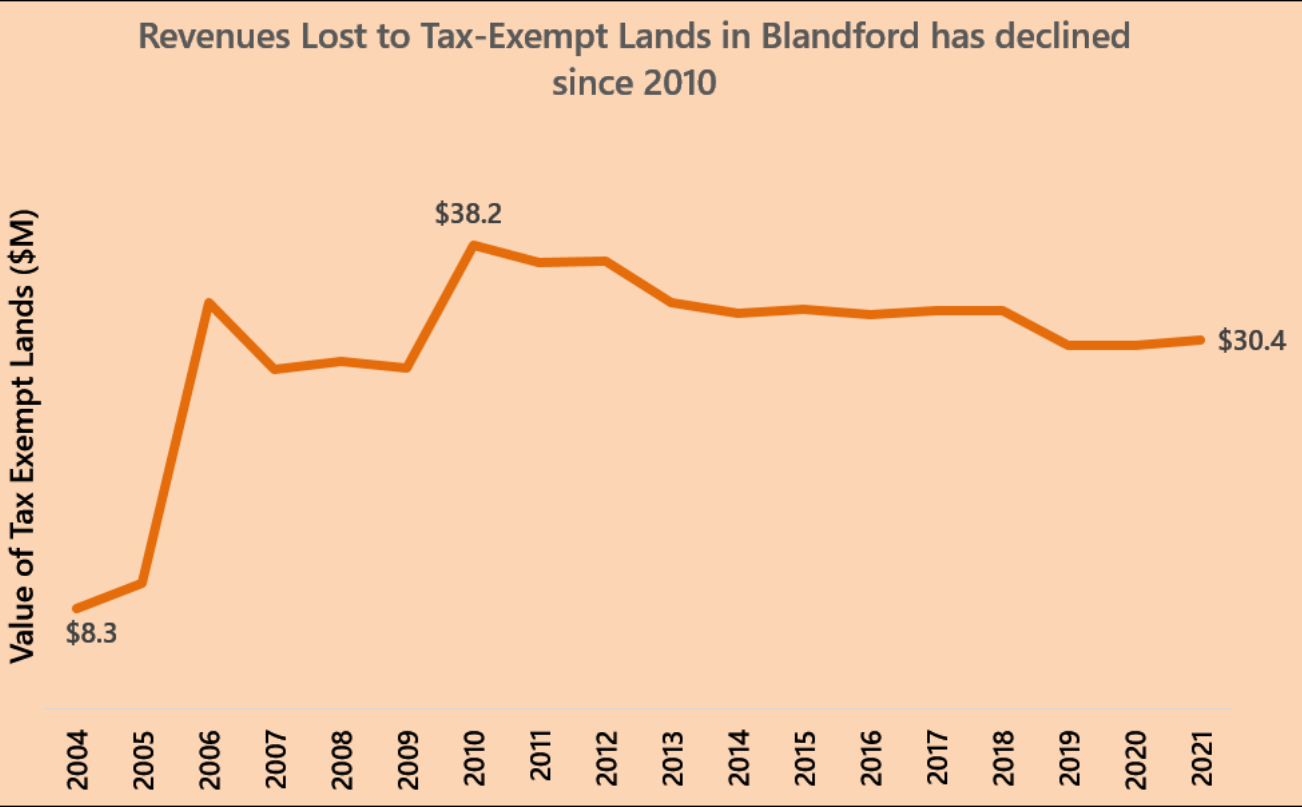


Even when adjusted for inflation, Blandford has been expanding its tax revenues over the course of the past 30+ years, as reflected in growth in average local tax bill for single family homes

Average Single Family Tax Bill

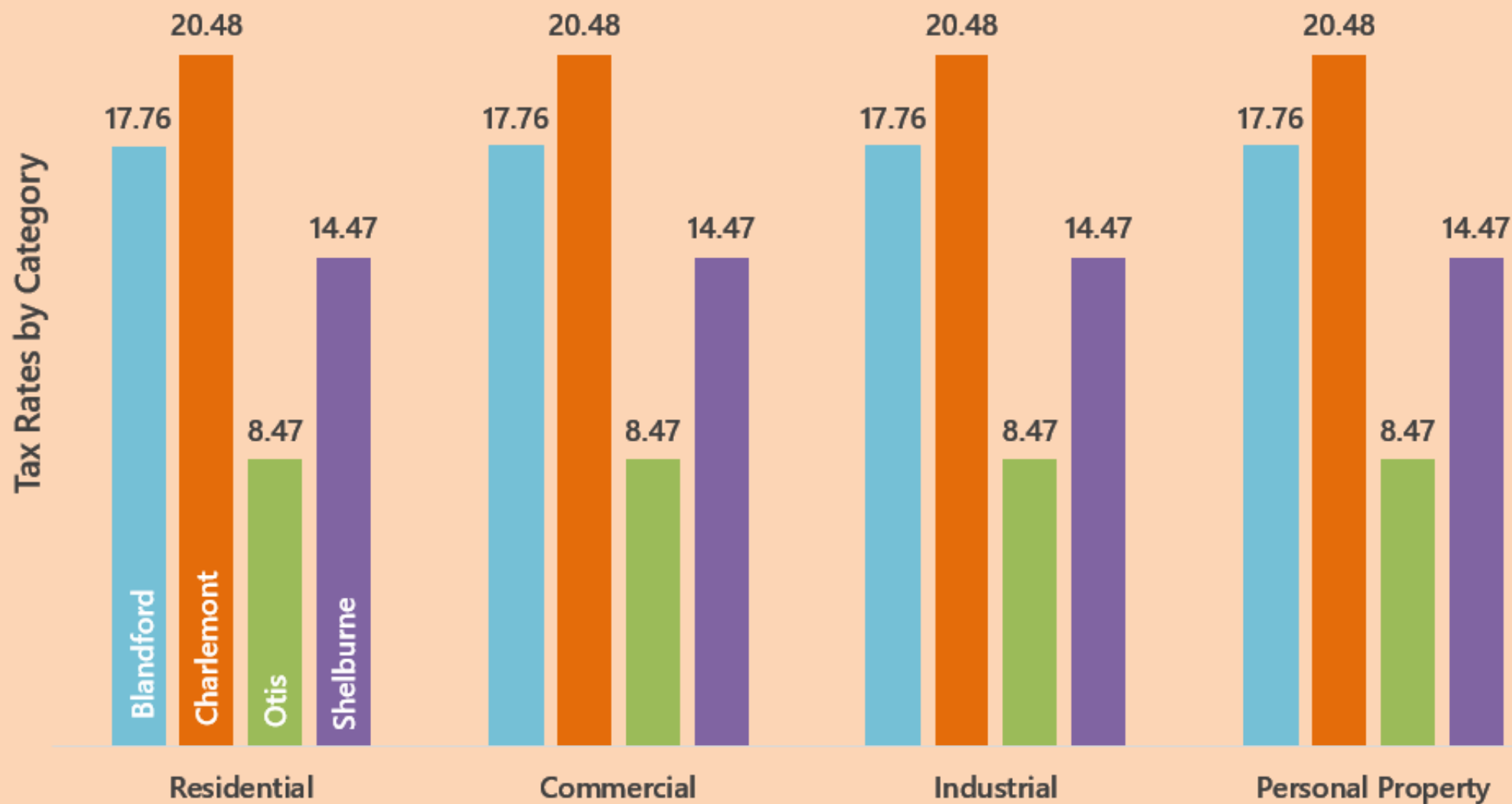

THE WHITE CHURCH OF BLANDFORD - Built in 1822, this original meetinghouse was fully renovated in 1993. The White Church is on the National Register of Historic Places. See the website for summer concert series and hours: thewhitechurch.org

Take in the Sanderson Falls, go mountain biking, enjoy a picnic or do some hunting and fishing. THE BLANDFORD FAIR - The Union Agricultural and Horticultural Society's Fair is an annual Labor Day weekend event and has been operating since 1867. This is an event you won't want to miss! www.theblandfordfair.com

ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS

- HILL CEMETERY & CHURCH LOOP - EASY**
Park your car in the lot across from the Blandford Historical Society to begin this walk through history! Cross North St. and follow the uphill path through the tall pine grove. Look to the east at the top of the hill, and on a clear day, you will see Springfield. Notice the oak tree surrounded by a metal fence, planted in 1935 in commemoration of the 200th anniversary. Loop through the Hill Cemetery, cross the road, and circle around The White Church of Blandford, owned by the Blandford Historical Society. 2022 is the 200th anniversary.
- WATSON MEMORIAL PARK LOOP - MODERATE**
Park on the side of the paved road just inside the park gate. For a gradual ascent, take the left at the fork. Reversing the direction provides an initial steep climb.
- KAOLIN RD LOOP - EASY**
This route includes a paved sidewalk followed by a lightly trafficked road that passes the library, store, and other community spots.
- HERRICK RD ROUTE - MODERATE**
Park at the trailhead for the Knittel Conservation area and enjoy this pleasant country walk with a minor hill that links to the center of town. Please be aware not to park at the gate at the dead-end of Herrick Rd; this is a Springfield Sewer and Water access point.

KNITTEL TRAILS: A parking area for access to these trails is on the right side of Herrick Rd, about halfway down. This trail system includes a main trail loop that is approximately 1.8 miles in length that straddles Herrick Rd. The eastern side of the trail is flatter and easier than the western side. For complete information, see townofblandford.com

- KNITTEL: WESTERN TRAIL - MODERATE**
The western trail travels through some steeper terrain, near a beaver pond, power lines, and dense Mountain Laurel. A side trail runs directly along the shore of the beaver pond where you can often observe beavers swimming at dusk, nesting great blue herons and other wildlife. Another trail that runs to the west and terminates at the boundary of the Knittel property is a great place to take in sunsets.
- KNITTEL: EASTERN TRAIL - MODERATE**
This part of the trail takes you through fields with a great view to the south, by a small pond, through wooded sections along Falls Brook (including several foot bridges), and runs along unique bedrock outcroppings.
- COBBLE MOUNTAIN RD LOOP - EASY**
This is an easy route, half on a lightly traveled paved road and dirt road on the return. Park at the intersection of Cobble Mountain Rd. and Birch Hill Rd. on the west side next to the chain-link fence.
- SANDERSON BROOK FALLS TRAIL - EASY TO MODERATE**
There is a very small parking area where the trail begins. The walk itself is well cleared, wide enough for 2-3 walkers side by side with a gradual decline and a nice sturdy bridge over a stream. No access to Sanderson Brook Falls as the bridge is still being repaired, but you can hear the water from this point!

TICK WARNING

- Check your body and clothing for ticks
- Use insect repellent
- Seek medical attention if rash or fever occurs

CHESTER BLANDFORD STATE FOREST TRAILS: Park on Beulah Land Rd. either on the left near #16 (do not block driveway or road) or drive down the narrow road and park near the gate.

- DYNAMITE BOX TRAIL - MODERATE**
Near the gate, notice a marker and map for the trail. Proceeding westward, you will pass Sanderson Brook, and at the junction of trails, look for a stone chimney and remains of a lodge. Hiking is moderate up and down, on rock and gravel footing.
- OBSERVATION HILL TRAIL - MODERATE**
Follow Beulah Land Rd. northward, enjoying a wide and well-cleared hike on a gravel road. Take a right onto Observation Hill Rd. for wide but steeper terrain. At the "T" take a left onto Mica Mine Rd, which brings you to Observation Hill. Walk around this beautiful area for a view of neighboring mountains.

TIPS FOR YOUR WALK



WARM-UP AND S-T-R-E-T-C-H!
Before starting any exercise, move around to warm-up your muscles (walk in place, etc).

REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING so you are prepared for any change of plans or weather:

- Water, food or snack
- Sunscreen or hat
- Bring an extra layer (jacket, etc.) and wear comfortable, supportive shoes
- Walking map
- Cell phone, emergency numbers

COOL DOWN - Slow your pace towards the end of the walk. Stretch your legs and arms.

BE SAFE!

- Wear bright, reflective clothing
- Walk against traffic on busier routes

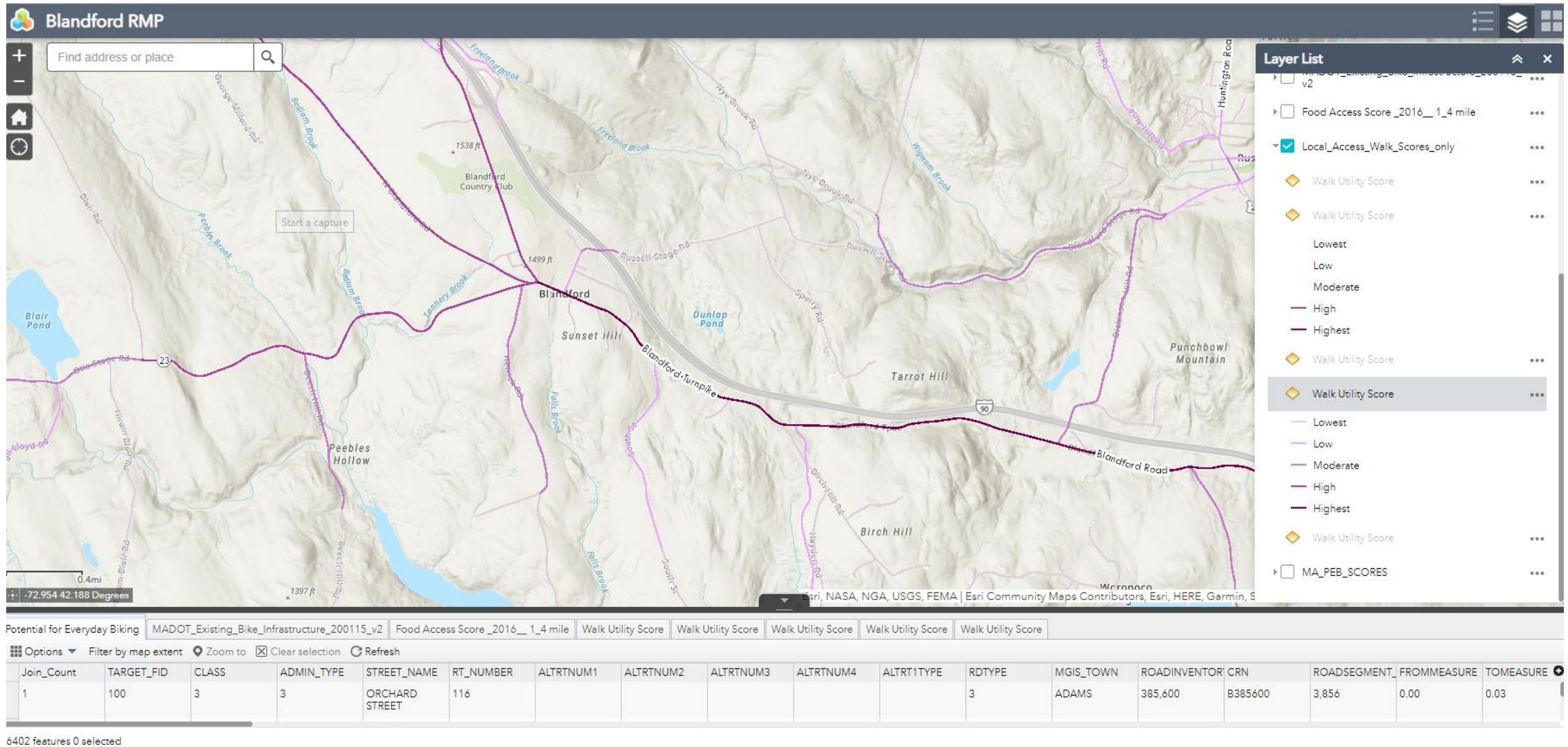

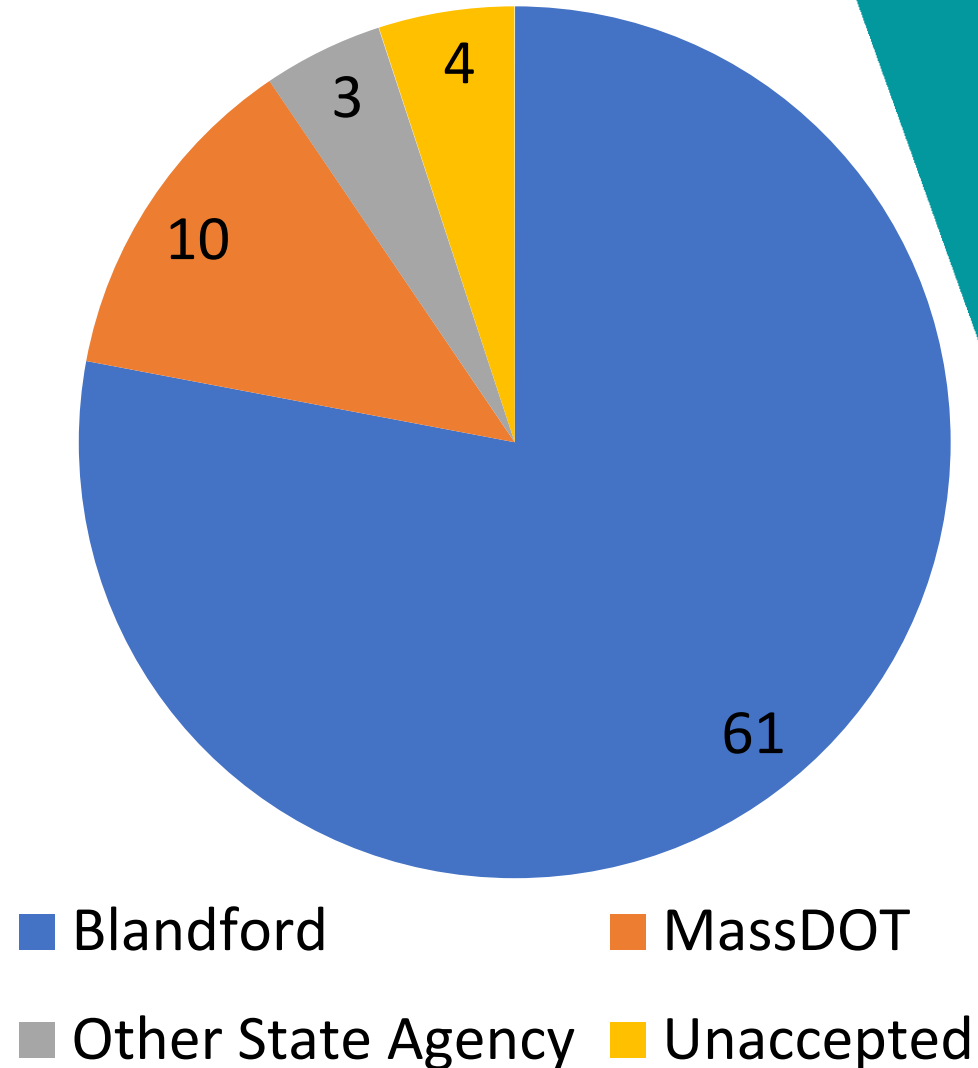

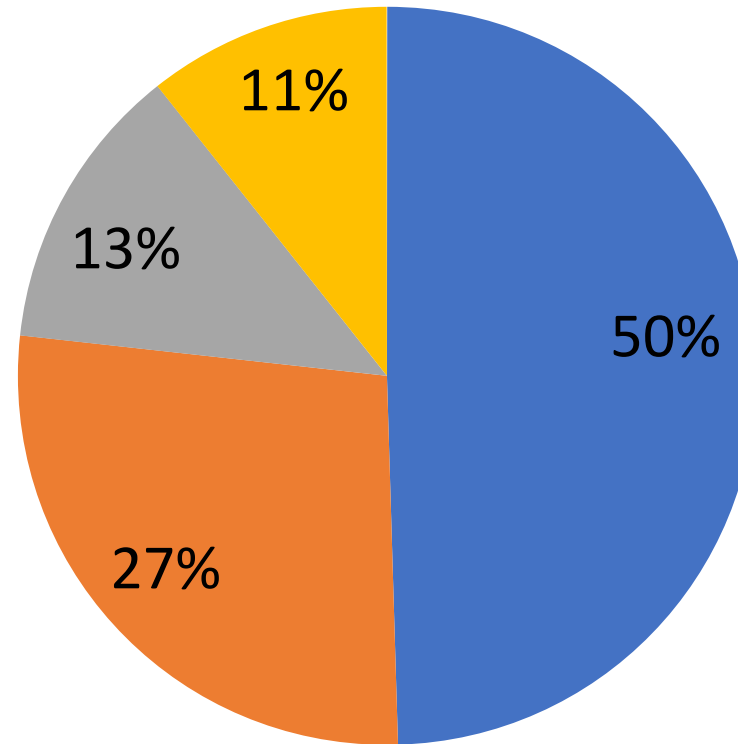
Non Interstate Jurisdiction (miles)

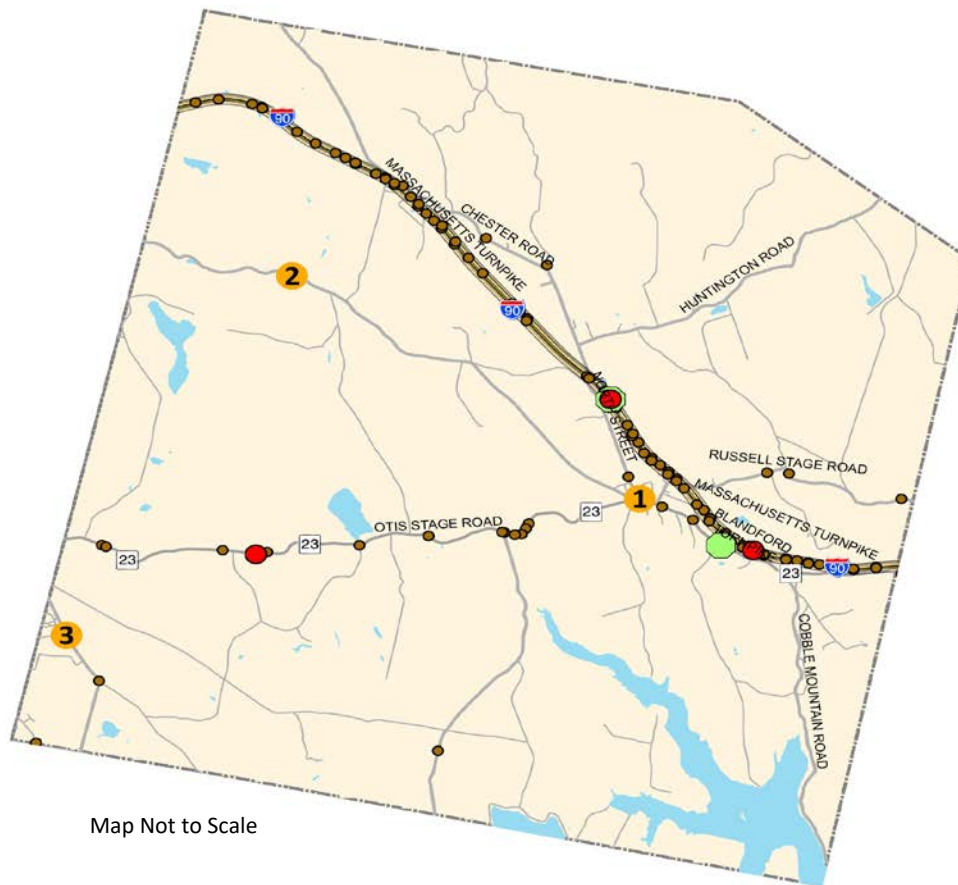

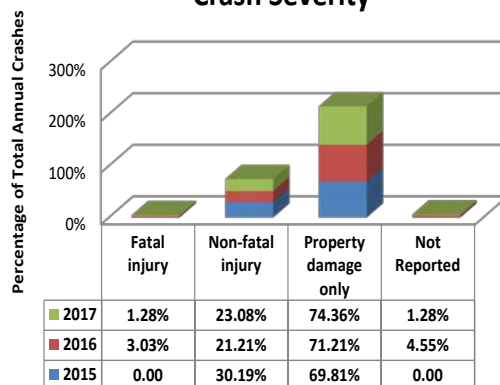

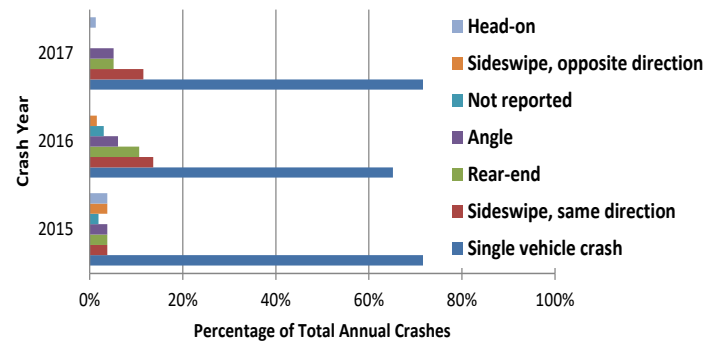

INTERSECTION CRASHES

Four intersection crashes were reported in Blandford (all property damage only) within the analysis period. Three of those crashes were geocoded. The locations of those crashes are depicted in the map and listed below:

1. Otis Stage Road (Route 23) and North Street
2. North Blandford Road and a Private Driveway
3. Otis Tolland Road and Westerly Road
4. (Not Geocoded Location)
At an unknown Y-intersection along Otis Tolland Road

**EPDO – Equivalent Property Damage Only (Fatal and Injury Crashes = 21, Property Damage Crashes = 1)*

KEY FINDINGS

- The total number of reported crashes in Blandford has increased each year within the three year analysis period.
- A total of 2 non-motorist crashes were recorded in Blandford between 2015 and 2017, one of which resulted in the fatality of a pedestrian.
- The other two fatal crashes occurred when drivers exceeded the authorized speed limit along Interstate I-90.
- Almost 80% of all collisions were single vehicle crashes.
- Almost all the reported crashes (190) were non intersection crashes, the majority of which (144) occurred along Interstate I-90.

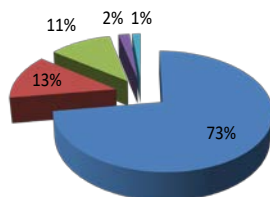

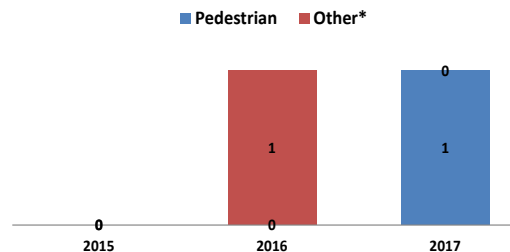

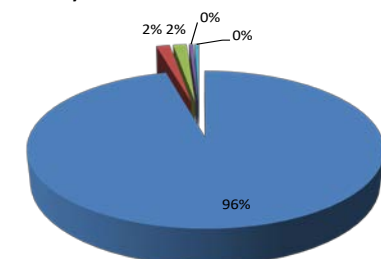
Non-motorist Crashes by Type and Year
