

HADLEY

Hadley is a growing residential community with a strong agricultural base. This scenic community is bordered on the west by the Connecticut River and on the south by the Mt. Holyoke range. One of the oldest settlements in the Commonwealth, Hadley was founded by English colonists in 1659 and grew into an active farming and trading center which today has the most acreage of farmland of any Pioneer Valley town.

The town center, with stately old colonial homes clustered around the large village green, presents a contrast to the commercial strip along Route 9 which connects the educational centers of Northampton and Amherst. A 70 acre industrial park is helping to link nearby UMASS-Amherst with local research and development firms.

Hadley has two village centers, the picturesque New England settlement of North Hadley, and Hadley Center-with notable historic homes. The Porter Phelps- Huntington House Museum, built in 1752, hosts folk music concerts and storytelling. Hadley became the birthplace of broom-making in 1797 and an important cultivator of broom corn thereafter. The Hadley Farm Museum houses a large collection of early New England farm machinery which illustrates the area's early way of life. A notable site is the Joseph Skinner State Park, on the Mt. Holyoke Range, which boasts a spectacular view from its 930-foot summit. The Summit House, recently renovated, was originally built in 1851.
