

WORTHINGTON

A small hilltown, Worthington has earned a reputation for being a center of innovation. Settled in 1768, at the eastern edge of the Berkshire Mountains, the Town's landscape is primarily rugged and forested; almost 90% of the land is undeveloped. Two state forests are located in Town.

Worthington's history is rich in agriculture, an industry which still flourishes today. In recent years, Worthington has also earned the reputation of having a center of entrepreneurship. Town residentis have developed new ventures in bio-technology, hand tools and baby furniture.

Culturally, Worthington is home to many artists, poets, writers and musicians and has gained national recognition for its hosting of the Sevenars Concerts. This musical venue is considered to be one of the best small music festivals in the country.

The population has declined slightly since 2000. However, residents are attracted to the rural landscape and the cosmopolitan character of Worthington. The majority of residents are professionally employed and commute out of town for work.
