The goal of this arrangement is to offer municipalities an independent perspective of their IT operations and to jointly develop solutions that cities and towns tell us they need.

Novus has worked with many cities and towns over the past 10 years and has considerable knowledge of the technology systems that are commonly installed, as well as how cities and towns generally operate.

Novus' objective when doing assessments is to provide an unbiased, independent view of a municipality's use of technology. The first step is a review of existing technology infrastructure and business processes. This includes examining hardware & software settings, applications, security controls, and network configurations.

Interviews with department heads and end users are then conducted to develop a full picture of the current technology footprint and its implication on town operations. Finally, a plan is developed to bridge the gap between the current state and where a town would like to be operating.
